This is to certify that at a meeting of the Court of Common Council, July 11, 2016, the following RESOLUTION was passed.

WHEREAS, The Connecticut Department of Transportation awards Major City Speed Enforcement Grants to municipalities for enforcement activities undertaken to reduce the number of crashes, injuries and fatalities from speed and other distracted driving behaviors; and

WHEREAS, Grant funds will be used by the Hartford Police Department to conduct high visibility enforcement to reduce the volume of fatalities and injuries resulting from high speed driving; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Mayor is hereby authorized to apply for and accept the Fiscal Year 2016 Major City Speed Enforcement Grant in the amount of \$37,500 from the Connecticut Department of Transportation's Highway Safety Office; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the City will provide the required local match of \$12,500 through the provision of fringe benefits to officers participating in the program; and be it further


RESOLVED, That the Mayor is authorized to accept such further sums as may be additionally awarded by the grantor under the same program, for the same authorized contract period, and for the same purposes; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Mayor is authorized to execute any and all manner of other documents and to take such other actions as he and the Corporation Counsel may deem appropriate and in the best interests of the City in order to receive, contract and expend the above referenced grant funds; and be it further

RESOLVED, That no person or entity shall be entitled to rely on, or otherwise claim any benefit by reason of this resolution should the Mayor fail to execute the aforementioned agreement or other documents, or to take any of the aforesaid actions; and be it further

RESOLVED, That all approvals and authorizations provided hereby are contingent upon, and only shall be effective on and by means of, the parties executing such documents, and taking such actions, all of which shall be, in form and substance, acceptable to the Mayor and the Corporation Counsel.

This is to certify that at a meeting of the Court of Common Council, July 11, 2016, the following RESOLUTION was passed.

WHEREAS, Hartford's birth rate to teenagers is significantly higher than the teen birth rate nationwide and significant negative health indicators are associated with these rates, such as high infant mortality rates and outcomes such as low birth weight, prematurity and maternal care issues; and

WHEREAS, By resolution dated September 28, 2015, the Court of Common Council authorized the City to accept a 5-year grant of \$5.0 million from the U.S. Department of Health & Human Services, through its Office of Adolescent Health to be used for Hartford's Teen Pregnancy Prevention Initiative (TPPI); and

WHEREAS, An important component of the TPPI is its reliance on diverse community providers to reach teens and provide services throughout the city in a variety of settings; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Council hereby authorizes the City to execute contracts with the providers named below for the Teen Pregnancy Prevention Initiative for a one-year term from July 1, 2016 through June 30, 2017;



This is to certify that at a meeting of the Court of Common Council, July 11, 2016, the following RESOLUTION was passed AS AMENDED.

WHEREAS, During current City budgetary restrictions there are calls for City employee layoffs and services reductions, as well as added revenues through new fees and surcharges on non-taxed businesses, organizations and agencies; and


WHEREAS, Any reductions in worker salaries and benefits through “shared sacrifice” must be *fairly and progressively* distributed according to ability to contribute and family need; and

WHEREAS, Layoffs of front-line City workers are particularly harmful to residents dependent on their services, as well as those front-line workers and their families who support local businesses and pay taxes here in the City; and

WHEREAS, One direct and simple means to reduce layoffs and service cuts to achieve budgetary savings is through a *progressive and proportional allocation of furlough days*, according to yearly basic income above \$50,000 and scaled with average daily wages; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, That for employees in all Departments citywide there be across the board allocated a fair “shared sacrifice” method for *progressive furlough days* per year, with savings based proportionally on wages or salary above \$50,000 per year.
