

This is to certify that at a meeting of the Court of Common Council, October 10, 2017, the following RESOLUTION was passed.

WHEREAS, The Connecticut Department of Transportation’s Highway Safety Office awards grants to municipalities for high visibility seatbelt enforcement through its Click It or Ticket Program, in order to reduce injuries and fatalities that result from failure to wear seatbelts; and

WHEREAS, The Click It or Ticket Program will cover 100% of police overtime costs (salaries and fringes) associated with Seatbelt Enforcement Media Checkpoints during the 2017 Thanksgiving and 2018 Memorial Day holiday periods; and

WHEREAS, The grant does not require the City to provide any matching funds; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Mayor is hereby authorized to apply for and accept the Click It or Ticket (Waves 53 & 54) Grant in the amount of \$15,820.86 (which includes the 49.12% fringe benefit cost of \$5,211.38) from the Connecticut Department of Transportation Highway Safety Office; and be it further


RESOLVED, That the Mayor is authorized to accept such further sums as may be additionally awarded by the grantor under the same program, for the same authorized contract period, and for the same purposes; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Mayor is authorized to execute any and all manner of other documents and to take such other actions as he and the Corporation Counsel may deem appropriate and in the best interests of the City in order to receive, contract and expend the above referenced grant funds; and be it further

RESOLVED, That no person or entity shall be entitled to rely on, or otherwise claim any benefit by reason of this resolution should the Mayor fail to execute the aforementioned agreement or other documents, or to take any of the aforesaid actions; and be it further

RESOLVED, That all approvals and authorizations provided hereby are contingent upon, and only shall be effective on and by means of, the parties executing such documents, and taking such actions, all of which shall be, in form and substance, acceptable to the Mayor and the Corporation Counsel.

WHEREAS, The Massa family has requested that the memorial park bench be installed in Goodwin Park; and


WHEREAS, The memorial bench comports with the standard dimensions and specifications of park benches installed throughout the City's parks system; now, therefore, be it

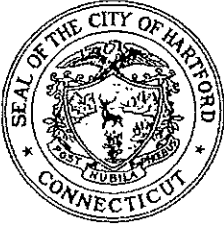


