This is to certify that at a meeting of the Court of Common Council, June 14, 2010 the following RESOLUTION was passed.

WHEREAS, Asthma is the leading cause of school absenteeism related to chronic illness; and

WHEREAS, Children aged birth through fourteen years of age who reside in the City of Hartford are three times more likely to be hospitalized for asthma compared to all Connecticut children; and

WHEREAS, Hartford has the highest rate of emergency room visits for asthma among children birth through fourteen years of age, accounting for 18 percent of all such visits; and

WHEREAS, The City of Hartford Health Department's Asthma Call to Action Task Force (ACTA), in partnership with the Central Connecticut Health District (CCHD) encourages Hartford residents to learn more about Asthma; and

WHEREAS, The Health and Human Services Department (HHS) shall receive funding from the Central Connecticut Health District (CCHD) to provide in-home services to Hartford residents; and

WHEREAS, Funds received by HHS will be used to fund the Health Educator to provide the "PUTTING ON AIRS" Program, to assist with environmental assessments and trigger identification sessions for low-income families who reside in Hartford; and

WHEREAS, The Central Connecticut Health District will reimburse HHS on a budgetary basis as follows:

Health Educator: \$33.00/hour, and Home Inspection: \$33.00/hour. The term of this contract is for the funding period, October 1, 2009 through September 30, 2012; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Mayor and the Court of Common Council do hereby authorize the acceptance and receipt of the additional funding that may become available to implement "PUTTING ON AIRS" Program; and be it further


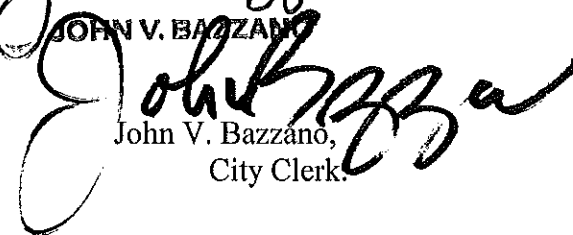

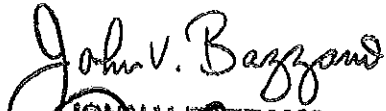

WHEREAS, City is the owner of the Parker Memorial Recreation Center in the North End of Hartford ("Parker Memorial"); and

WHEREAS, the Hartford Foundation for Public Giving (the "Foundation") has made planning and implementation grants for the period of 2010 to 2014 of up to Four Hundred Fifty Thousand and no/100 (\$450,000.00) available through an application and approval process (collectively, the "Grant"); and

WHEREAS, if awarded, the Grant is to be used to facilitate the development and operation of a family center (the "Family Center") at newly renewed Parker Memorial. The Family Center will be developed and operated by a community based organization selected by HHS in consultation with the Foundation (the "Provider Organization") and the Parent Advisory Commission and it will be modeled upon other family centers funded by the Foundation; and

WHEREAS, the Family Center will serve parents of children living in the North End neighborhoods by providing family literacy programs, parenting skills and parent advocacy training and adult education programs. The Grant funded partnership between the City, the Foundation and the Provider Organization selected to develop and operate the Family Center will enhance recreation and other programming provided by the Department of Health and Human Services' Recreation Division; and

WHEREAS, subject to the terms and conditions set forth below, The selected Provider Organization shall execute a license agreement with the City to allow their use of space within Parker Memorial and to otherwise set forth and delineate their respective rights and obligations with respect to such use.

- Initial term is for one (1) year, commencing as soon as practicable following the selection of the provider organization with three (3) options to renew for one (1) year each provided that Grant funding is available for such renewal options.
- The license agreement will require proof of insurance from the Provider Organization in accordance with the City's risk management guidelines but will not otherwise require payment from the Provider Organization to the City for use of Parker Memorial in accordance with the terms of the license agreement; now therefore be it

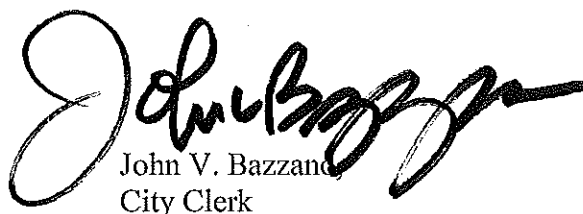

RESOLVED, That before selling any tax lien, the City of Hartford shall send a letter to the last known address of the delinquent tax payer informing them of their delinquent taxes and the impending sale of their tax lien to a collection agency; and, be it further

RESOLVED, That the City of Hartford shall include as a condition of sale of any tax liens that the Lien Buyer shall make its first attempt to collect within thirty (30) days of the completion of the purchase of the tax liens from the City.
